Director Eligibility--Qualifications. To be eligible to serve, whether elected or appointed, the person MUST:

- 1. TEXAS CONSTITUTION, Art. 16, § 14--reside within the district
- 2. TEXAS WATER CODE § 53.063: be a registered voter of the district
- 3. TEXAS ELECTION CODE § 141.001(a):
 - 1. be a United States Citizen
 - 2. be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled, or on the day appointed
 - 3. have not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court
 - 4. have not been finally convicted of a felony from which he or she has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities
 - 5. have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the territory from which the office is elected for six months immediately preceding the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot
 - 6. satisfy any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law for the office
